How much does electricity cost in Thailand?

The electricity price for businesses is THB 4.268 kWh or USD 0.131. Electricity bills in Thailand are set to stay stubbornly high for the rest of the year, despite falling fuel costs, lower demand and a stronger baht.

Will Thailand reduce electricity prices in May 2025?

Proposal to lower power bills for May to August period receives cabinet approval, pending Energy Regulatory Commission finalization. On April 1, 2025, the Thai Cabinet approved a proposal to reduce electricity prices from 4.15 baht per kilowatt hour to 3.99 baht for the billing period spanning May 1 to August 31, 2025.

How often are Thailand's electricity tariffs reviewed?

Thailand's electricity tariffs are reviewed every four months, adjusted to reflect fluctuating fuel costs, exchange rates, and other economic variables. The current rate of 4.15 baht per kWh, in place since January 2025, has been a point of contention as households grapple with high energy prices driven by global fuel market volatility.
